



Summary

Apple OSX 10.6.x sometimes has trouble playing Flash Video embedded on web pages. One solution identified to correct this problem is to disable “Hardware Acceleration” in the Adobe Flash Player Settings. The following are step-by-step instructions to disable the “Hardware Acceleration.”

	<p>Open Safari or Chrome and navigate to a page with embedded Flash Video (http://studiog.unlv.tv).</p> <p>Right click inside the blank video screen to bring up the Adobe Flash Player options menu and select “settings.”</p> <p>(This procedure can also be completed in Firefox but it’s been our experience that the Adobe Flash Player settings in Firefox exhibit unexpected behavior requiring a restart of the browser to close the control panel).</p>
	<p>Select the left most tab on the settings dialog box with the monitor icon if it is not already selected. Click on the “Enable hardware acceleration” check box to de-select the option.</p> <p>Finally, close the Adobe Flash Player Settings by clicking on the “Close” button.</p> <p>The page may need to be refreshed or the browser restarted for settings to take affect.</p>
